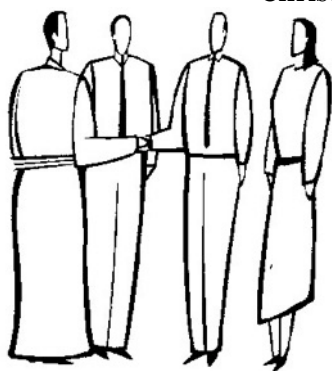

L'Arche Meets May 6

L'Arche meets in the narthex at 6:30 p.m. on the first Monday of the month.

Since the Fall of 2023, we have met monthly to carry our initial inspiration forward utilizing the guidance of l'Arche International and regular weekly strategy / planning sessions with Pastor Barker. Each monthly meeting includes a time of welcoming, prayer, films about

l'Arche and time for casual conversation and fellowship.

L'Arche began in 1964 as a safe haven for two men with intellectual disabilities who had suffered in the inhumane conditions of a local mental institution. Today, there are over 132 communities across the world. L'Arche has endured because of



its core values of mutual respect between (disabled) core members of the community and assistants who are dedicated to helping them identify their gifts and thrive as unique persons. It is faith-based via its Christian origins but welcomes all faiths or those with no faith.
